

Reflective 9-1-1 Addressing Saves Lives!

Is your house number visible? You may think that the numbers are plenty visible, but try driving around at night in a neighborhood you are not familiar with and imagine that you were just called out at 3 a.m. to help someone having a heart attack or stroke. Quite simply, most of the numbers currently on houses are not adequately visible. Every Community Wildfire Protection Plan in Grand County has cited poor addressing as a critical problem for all areas. Visible address signs are not only important in wildfire situations, but medical emergencies and house fires as well.

The Grand County Wildfire Council is making and selling uniform metal signs with green backgrounds and reflective numbers. You can purchase a sign online for your property at www.bewildfireready.org.
